

### TRACES OF THE CAMP ARE STILL VISIBLE TODAY

The Adventure Trail Wallenstein's Camp follows the boundaries of a historical camp. It was here that Albrecht von Wallenstein and the soldiers of the Catholic League laid siege to fortified Nuremberg in 1632. His opponent, King Gustavus Adolphus of Sweden, had retreated with his troops into the city. On 3 September 1632, the battle finally took place at the Alte Veste. For the local population, the impact of the war was devastating. Many traces of the camp can still be found in the landscape today.

### INTERACTIVE IMMERSION IN WHAT TOOK PLACE

Along the Adventure Trail Wallenstein's Camp, 28 interactive pillars provide information about the events of the time, imparting knowledge in a playful way. The Thirty Years' War and the dimensions of the siege all become tangible by walking along the former fortifications, "eavesdropping" on

protagonists of the time and discovering artefacts. For example, you can find out how much bread and meat a single soldier was entitled to, or what punishments deserters were subject to at the place of execution in Wallenstein's camp.

The app gives you the chance to immerse yourself in the field camp through multimedia, learning more about life at the time and the impact of the Thirty Years' War:

A sutler's wife, a musketeer and a soldier's boy talk about their lives in short audio pieces.

Let yourself be whisked away through short films on life in the camp in 1632, observe all the hustle and bustle at the marketplace and learn about the soldiers' equipment. History buffs who would like to delve deeper into the historical context also have plenty to discover in the app. Detailed texts are available for all the experiential stations and excerpts from original sources can be read and listened to.

## Adventure Trail Wallenstein's Camp THE CIRCULAR ROUTE



Our journey starts in Stein-Unterweihersbuch. The starting point is easy to reach by bus and underground from Nuremberg. Parking is available at the corner of Unterweihersbucher Straße and Asbacher Weg. From here, follow the signs for the circular route.

The first interactive pillar 10 welcomes us at the cultural centre "Kulturhaus des Bezirks Mittelfranken" (Asbacher Weg 3). From here we continue out of the town. At the Peace of Westphalia 3 pillar, turn north and enter directly into the forest, always following the markers for the circular route.

At the Mass grave 6 pillar, the circular route marker leads into the Hainberg Nature Reserve. The southern connecting path, highlighted in blue 🐉 turns off here 🙃 slightly to the left and then right into the Hainberg.



Follow the circular route through the Hainberg and paths along the Bibert River to the pillar of the Croatian cavalry 1 in Zirndorf. Here you have the option of walking the northern connecting path, highlighted in green. 🦹

The circular route leads to the Alte Veste 10 and on via the forest playground at Achterplätzchen and the Kneippallee regional railway station into the town centre and the Zirndorf Municipal Museum 15. The exhibition here is well worth a visit! From there the route continues along Spitalstraße and Volkhardtstraße to the Bibert River.

The circular route runs straight past the Camp's western front (6) The northern connecting path turns off to the left.

From Humboldtstraße we turn onto Albrecht-Dürer-Straße to reach the Lodgings station **10** . Then the southern connecting path begins on the left.

Continuing straight ahead, we finally reach the Place of execution in Wallenstein's camp (1) at the Oberasbach S-Bahn stop. Follow the signs | along the railway underpass to Petershöhe. After the Infirmary 19 station, take the next field path on the left towards the Hölzleshof equestrian facility. Cross the street Oberasbacher Weg, back to the Peace of Westphalia 3 pillar.

### TOUR DATA CIRCULAR ROUTE

- Distance: 20.4 km Walking time: 5:10 h
- Ascent: 127 m
- Descent: 110 m



The markers now continue either to the left and straight ahead on the pathway to the Unterasbach S-Bahn stop. 👔 Or straight and to the right along the historic ramparts to the Südschanze 2 and, from here, following the main marker back to the starting point.

Scanning the QR code at each pillar activates new content in the app. There are information and experiential stations in all sections of the route, enabling varied, personalised route planning.



In the immediate vicinity of the route, numerous restaurants invite you to stop for a bite to eat, while playgrounds and benches invite you to relax and linger.

The starting and finishing points can be chosen freely and are perfectly connected to the public transport system.
